PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven and to bring us to eternal life. Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.

Lord God, we have sinned against you, through our own fault, in thought, in word and deed, and in those things we have failed to do. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. Please forgive us all that is past and help us to live each day in the light of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

THE SERMON

THE CREED (please stand)

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. Amen.

PRAYERS (please sit or kneel)

Prayers are offered for the Church, the world, the local community, those who suffer and the community of saints. The response is:

Lord in your mercy.

Hear our prayer.

At the end is said

Merciful Father

Accept these prayers

for the sake of you Son
our Saviour Jesus Christ, Amen.

THE PEACE (please stand)

Christ is our peace. He has reconciled us to God in one body by the cross. We meet in his name and share his peace. The peace of the Lord be always with you.

And also with you.

All may exchange a sign of peace.

HYMN (during which a collection is taken)

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER (please sit or kneel)

The Lord is here.

His Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself. When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in your Son.

You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us.

He opened wide his arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with friends, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying, take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

Father we do this in remembrance of him; his body is the bread of life.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks and said; drink this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me.

Father, we do this in remembrance of him; his blood is shed for all.

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us one in Christ our risen Lord.

With the whole Church throughout the world We offer you this sacrifice of praise and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven:

Heaven and earth are full of thy glory.

Glory be to thee, O Lord most high.

Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna, hosanna in the highest!




SANCTUS & BENEDICTUS Caleb Simper, 1856-1942
