Speaker 1	For the bread to be baked and the people fed we must first plough the fields.

Speaker 3	So we bring this ploughshare here for you to give your blessing upon it and upon all the work done on our farms.
Speaker 1	God speed the plough: the plough and the ploughman

the farm and the farmer.

Speaker 2 God speed the plough:

the beam and the mouldboard, the land slides and the wings

the points, sheres and the disc coulters

Speaker 3 God speed the plough:

in fair weather and foul, in rain and in wind,

in frost and in sunshine: God speed the plough.

We ask your blessing Father God on this plough and on all the machines that enable us to work upon your land. We ask you to prosper and bless throughout the year the work of our farmers that their hopes may be fulfilled with a plentiful harvest and that the people may be fed with wholesome food: through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

We thank thee then, O Father, for all things bright and good, the seed time and the harvest, our life, our health, our food.


Accept the gifts we offer for all thy love imparts, and, what thou most desirest, our humble, thankful hearts.
